The Windrush Caribbean Film Festival (WCFF) aims to engage and educate audiences in cinemas and art venues across the UK about the contributions of the Windrush generation and its impact on the country through screenings, talkbacks and micro-cinema challenge that will take place in cinemas, schools and community centres across the country.

WCFF will include films whose themes are centred around racism, colonialism, immigration, and cultural contributions, with the goal of airing, discussing and celebrating this iconic generation.

### KINGSWAY PROJECT UK | 2021 | 2M

Carnival is an expression of freedom that usually attracts tourists from all over the world to its hosting city. It is a vibrant event -- with floats, dancers in colourful costumes, large parades, an abundance of food, music and festivities. However, there is always much more to Carnival. It has an important social, political and cultural role to play.



### **PARADISE LOST**

### CHRISTOPHER LAIRD TRINIDAD & TOBAGO | 2015 | 35M

Masman, Peter Minshall, remembers

"Paradise Lost" the first "mas" band he ever created. He was invited by Stephen Lee Heung, a veteran producer of masquerade bands, to create his band for Trinidad's

Carnival 1976. This documentary provides a blank canvas for Minshall, in all his personality, to showcase this memoir -- from the dawning of the concept to the band crossing the stage at the Queen's Park Savannah. The legendary Masman tells the story as only Minshall can..... expertly aided by his beautiful drawings of the costumes and live footage of the occasion.

The film captures Minshall's flair for costume.

As well, it presents the enigma of a designer /
artist whose main job seems to expose the
confrontation between Good and Evil against
the backdrop of the celebrations. His calling, as
such, is to awaken themes about humanity that
not only display a curious slant in art but also
inform the audiences that are privileged to
discern the value of his work.







### THE PRODIGAL SON

### KURT ORDERSON UK | 2012 | 59M

The "Prodigal Son" retraces the lost history of the Orderson family, and the West Indian community who left the Caribbean in the late 1800's as emancipated slaves, to settle in District Six, Cape Town. Orderson's mission reclaims a crucial layer of history of the Cape's Caribbean Diaspora community with a vital contemporary relevance.

# NOTTING HILL CARNIVAL, WHO STARTED IT?

### WYNN BAPTISTE UK | 2014 | 22M

Wyn Baptiste discovers that the origins of Carnival in London are as tangled as the history of London itself. As he meets key players who were actually there with his dad, he goes on a journey that takes in mass immigration, the 1958 Race Riots, pioneering social workers, Trinidadian steel pan players – and adventure playgrounds.

### JUS SOLI

### JOSHUA LLEWELLYN & SIMON JENKINS UK

An experimental film that charts the changing emotions of Britain's Black population --, from a Caribbean person on the SS Windrush: full of hope and love for the "Motherland" to a disaffected British youth, angry, alienated and marginalised in British society. The film splices together archival footage, scenes, sounds and images to build an image of Britain struggling to relinquish its colonial powers.

### **ROARING LION**

### ISHMAHIL BLAGROVE | UK | 2012 | 59M

Roaring Lion charts the growth and development of the Rastafarian Movement and its founder, the former Garveyite Leonard Howell. With interviews from the renowned academic and Rasta scholar Professor Barry Chevannes and several of the movement's leading figures, Mortimmo Plano, Fimore Alvaranga, Dago and Gertrude Campbell, the documentary charts the Movement's growth from a persecuted commune in the foothills of Pinnacle, Jamaica, to an internationally recognized religion.

### GREGORY STENNATT GORDON | UK | 1993 | 2M

Optical luminaries dot the bust of King Hayla I lending themselves to angels dancing around an open fire. For the duration of approximately two and half minutes, viewers can quietly leave or join this magical waltz.

A ground-breaking and disruptive Spoken Word film, created by Lisa Nichols, Sean Smith, and acclaimed actor & poet David Bianchi. It depicts the polarizing struggle between Black and White people in America. "Let's Grow" bravely confronts -- in an emotional and unapologetic manner -- the uncomfortable and polarizing conversations that Americans are having with each other today.

# ROSE GRENFELL THE PEACEMAKER

### THE KINGSWAY PROJECT UK | 2020 | 7M

The story of the Black missionary, Rose Grenfell, and the part she played in missionary work is often not known. Born Rose Patience Edgerly, she was an active member of the growing Baptist Church where her parents were leading church workers. She then met and married George Grenfell, an explorer and a missionary with the Baptist Missions Society. As a missionary's wife, Rose did nothing officially. Indirectly, however, she contributed significantly by working for peace. People turned to Rose frequently, and she gained a reputation as a peacemaker.

The Windrush 70th Anniversary celebrates the pioneering, Windrush generation that came to Britain. They have helped to shape British social, cultural and political life. ### JOVIAN WADE | UK/USA | 2020 | 10M

A moving spoken word short film, inspired by the old negro spiritual 'Wade in the Water', is about three men unveiling their fear of being a black man in America. Black History Month in the UK this year feels more significant than ever. It is a beautiful opportunity for us to be reminded of how far we have come but yet how far we still have to go.

### CARIBBEAN EYE: FILM CARIBBEAN

CHRISTOPHER LAIRD, BRUCE PADDINGTON AND TONY HALL TRINIDAD & TOBAGO | 1992 | 45M

Except for Cuba, there has been extremely limited film production in the Caribbean. Fortunately, this is changing, and Film Caribbean looks at some of the factors which influence regional production, reviewing some of the best of what has been done, and is being done, and what the future holds for Caribbean film-making. Located at the Images Caraibes, Caribbean Film Festival in Martinique, Film Caribbean interviews film makers from the Dutch, French, Spanish and English-speaking Caribbean and show excerpts from their films. This is the only video program available on this subject to date.

# CARIBBEAN EYE: COMMUNITY CELEBRATIONS

CHRISTOPHER LAIRD, BRUCE PADDINGTON AND TONY HALL TRINIDAD & TOBAGO | 1992 | 45M

The Caribbean is a meeting place of all the world's cultures.

Festivals create and sustain a sense of community. This programme looks at some of the folk festivals of the region (other than carnivals):\_ the Hindu festival of Phagwa in Trinidad & Guyana; the La Rose & La Marguerite flowers festivals in St. Lucia; the Johnkunnu of Jamaica, Belize and Bahamas; Masquerade in Guyana and St. Kitts and the Shi'ite festival of Hosein in Trinidad & Jamaica.

### NO BOIS MAN NO FRAID

### **CHRISTOPHER LAIRD** TRINIDAD & TOBAGO | 2014 | 48M

Two young Trinidadian internationally certified multidisciplinary martial artists re-discovered their roots in the unique Trinidadian martial art of Kalinda or Stick fighting and were accepted for mentorship by living legends of the art. We follow Keegan and Benji as with humility, respect and the total commitment of the martial artist as they enter the potentially lethal arena of the Gayelle which is to them like "a ring of liberation where I am a human being and I deserve to be alive and anybody in this circle I respect -- because they understand the value of life."

Having experienced poverty and racism in his life, he wants to shape the society he lives in and believes political office will give him the power to do so. In 2012 he runs for mayor in Bristol, UK. The journey into politics hits him with rejection, failure and an inner struggle that eventually leads to the biggest challenge of his life. This film is about the desire to overcome doubt and the boundaries between social background and power.

# NOTTING HILL: 21ST CENTURY CARNIVAL

### MATTHEW BARTLETT & JAMES KERMACK UK | 2013 | 47M

Fanon is an ambitious young African filmmaker attending an international film festival. She is desperately looking for a producer to fund her debut feature film but the more that Fanon explores and observes the festival space the more she begins to question whether she will ever find her place in this world.



### AFTER MAS

### KAREN MARTINEZ TRINIDAD & TOBAGO | 2013

After Mas tells the story of a love that flourishes under the cover of darkness during the festival of Jouvay on the streets of Port-of-Spain. Shot in Trinidad in February 2013 during Carnival, we experience the charge of this bacchanalian drama before following the characters return to their separate lives. In the cold light of day, can these young lovers from very different backgrounds stay true to their desires?



# JAB! THE BLUE DEVILS OF PARAMIN

### ALEX DEVERTEUIL TRINIDAD & TOBAGO | 2006

Isolated in the mountains of Trinidad, the district of Paramin, once a year at Carnival time, sheds its rural languor and erupts into an inferno of blue-painted 'jabs' or devils. Kootoo, King Devil, prepares with his three brothers to win the village competition once again for the most convincing devil band. Known for his athletic prowess and given to extraordinary feats like ripping up trees and scaling tall buildings, the charismatic Kootoo must still work hard with his band of devils to win the prize in the face of serious competition from a new generation of 'jabs'.

### MIXED ↑

### HOWARD J DAVIS | CANADA | 2020 | 1HR 16M

Mixed ↑ is a reclaimed book of genesis: a manifesto that collides the wildly diverse elements of being queer, mixed and different in a world socialized around the construction of race, gender and orientation. Featuring Haui's biological and found family including: actress/activist Tantoo Cardinal; stage and screen performer Thom Allison.

### **DYING SWAN**

### CHRISTOPHER LAIRD | TRINIDAD & TOBAGO | 2016 | 10M

In 2016, Mas artist, Peter Minshall, produced his first mas for Carnival in nearly ten years, reinterpreting Mikhail Fokine's classic ballet The Dying Swan for a 'Moko Jumbie' (a stilt dancer) in drag. This film chronicles the assemblage and performance of this mas at the King of Carnival Competition in February 2016.

Set in modern London, this crime drama follows Stephanie (an undercover weed dealer) who is coming to a crossroads in her life. She is pregnant, starting to hear voices, her boyfriend is becoming aloof, her ex-girlfriend is also acting weird & Stephanie's once under control world is starting to unravel. With all this pressure seeping into her life, will she be able to make the right choice or will events in her community make one for her? Welcome to the uniquely brilliant world of STASH.

# STEP BACK RICHARD KATTAH | UK | 2021 | 28M



### S.O.U.L. OF A BLACK WOMAN


### RCL GRAHAM UK | 2019 | 20M
